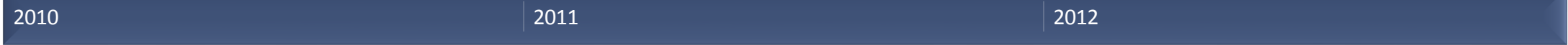

Gbagbo dissolves electoral commission  
2/12/2010

Gbagbo secures 38% of the vote during the Presidential Elections that had 81% turnout rate  
10/31/2010

Constitutional Court declares Gbagbo the winner and dispute escalates into violence  
12/4/2010

With a high turnout of more than 81% Ouattara is declared winner during the runoff elections, however Gbagbo challenges the results  
11/28/2010

Ouattara is sworn as President after Gbagbo is captured  
5/11/2011

Truth, Reconciliation and Dialogue Commission is launched to forge unity after post-election violence  
11/28/2011

Legislative elections are boycotted by the FPI. These elections see a low turnout of 36.5% and only 11.02% of elected women.

Ouattara dissolves government after a row between the parties

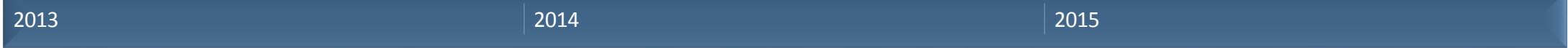

Local and regional elections pass off peacefully after tensions during campaigning, however turnout is very low

Ouattara signs legislation to establish a new electoral commission with representatives from civil society organizations and opposition parties

A peaceful presidential election takes place as Ouattara is re-elected with a 52.8% voter turnout
