



NDI Will Deploy Pre-Election Assessment Mission Ahead of 2025 General Elections in Honduras

August 1, 2025

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The National Democratic Institute (NDI) will deploy a Pre-Election Assessment Mission (PEAM) to Honduras from August 4-8, 2025, in advance of the country’s general elections scheduled for November.

The mission aims to gather information on the preparations for the elections and the context in which they are taking place, in order to identify key developments and offer recommendations for consideration by relevant political, electoral, institutional and civil society actors, as well as the international community. These recommendations seek to contribute to participatory, transparent and accountable elections and to strengthen public confidence in the process.

During its visit, the delegation will meet with a wide array of stakeholders across the political spectrum, including senior government officials, electoral authorities, political party leaders, civil society organizations, and candidates, as well as representatives of the international community.

The mission is co-led by Katia Uriona, former president of the Supreme Electoral Tribunal of Bolivia, and Juan Carlos Galindo, former National Registrar of Civil Status of Colombia. The delegation brings together a diverse group of experts and includes representatives and affiliates of the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), the International Republican Institute (IRI), and regional and electoral specialists from NDI.

The cross-institutional composition of the mission reflects broad international support for Honduras’ democratic development and its commitment to accompanying this electoral process. By listening and engaging all major stakeholders, the mission aims to contribute to building public confidence in the process and promoting elections that reflect the will of the Honduran people.

Preliminary findings and recommendations will be shared on Friday, August 8. A final report will be made publicly available in the weeks following the mission.

NDI’s assessment is being conducted in accordance with Honduran law and the [Declaration of Principles for International Election Observation](#), which outlines standards for impartial and professional election observation.
